The Gift that Keeps on Giving

There is no better feeling than providing the ability to significantly change someone's life. Imagine watching a family who has struggled economically, receive the keys to a new home, knowing you were instrumental in making it happen. And, if your gift can lessen your own tax burden, all the better!

Greater Albuquerque Habitat for Humanity has MFA-approved Affordable Housing developments that may directly receive donations from the New Mexico State Tax Credit Program. Donations from individuals and businesses aid in constructing affordable housing statewide, offering a 50% state tax credit based on the donation's value. Donations made directly to Habitat for Humanity - may include land, buildings, monetary funds, or services.

Greater Albuquerque Habitat for Humanity is finishing up a neighborhood in the Clifton/Williams neighborhood of southeast Albuquerque. This development was awarded substantial tax credit incentives as part of the 2022 New Mexico Affordable Housing Tax Credit Program. The purpose of the tax credits is to enable us to generate contributions to assist with new construction of a neighborhood for households with incomes at or below 60% of the Area Median Income. Our next developments - 62nd and 64th Streets, will also offer this incredible incentive to donors.

"The New Mexico State Tax Credit program has singularly been the most beneficial aspect of our new construction fundraising campaign," said Greater Albuquerque Habitat for Humanity Director of Development, Liz Vincent. "It provides our donors with an incredible incentive to increase their giving while receiving benefits on their gifts, annual distributions, and planned gifts. We could not have planned or started construction on our newest neighborhood on Clifton Southeast without the program."

Toye joins Bob as the Administrative Assistant for the Construction Department. She is working closely with both Bob and our Construction Manager, Rick Crouse, to assist homeowners to file their paperwork for the grant program and coordinating project assessments for Bob and Rick, keeping Bob and Rick organized (a hefty responsibility alone).





Her excitement at being a member of the GAHH team is palpable and truly reflects her approach to life - "My role in this world is service. I go out of my way to help people because my heart grows when I can bring a smile to their face. In knowing that I have, in some way, reduced the stress in their life and provided a measure of comfort to them, is my joy. Habitat allows me to fulfill this internal desire because we do this for people."
