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Letter from our Executive Director Bill Bidal

Dear Friends and Supporters:

Thank you for your strong commitment helping us to provide and maintain safe, affordable housing for families in need.

As we leave 2025, we face a severe nationwide housing crisis that is clearly an issue we share here in Central New Mexico. Our Albuquerque metro leadership measures our local shortage at upwards of 30,000 housing units needed across our metro area to meet current demand.

There are many challenges that complicate this issue, including ever rising construction, land, and engineering costs, limited existing affordable options, interest rates, and growing economic hardships that impact many families in our area and make it very difficult for those struggling to find a decent place to call home.

Our mission is to build affordable homes for those with the dream of raising their families in a home they can call their own. Providing home preservation and critical systems replacement for hard working lower income homeowners that gives safety, and security aligns with this mission. We believe that everyone deserves a place to call home, and we work every day to help people become homeowners for the first time and realize their dreams while also via our repair programs keeping existing mostly senior homeowners safely in their residences.

Over the past year we have moved three families into their new forever homes, repaired over thirty-five homes, and through the Habitat Affiliates Tithe program supported home construction by our Guatemala Habitat affiliate. In our growing role as a developer, we have made great progress in planning for our next three neighborhoods for which we aim to build eighteen homes in the 2026-to-2028-time window.

Our Greater Albuquerque Habitat for Humanity ReStore achieved number 1 status amongst all Habitat USA ReStores for the fourth year in a row. The ReStore sells donated new and gently used building materials, appliances, furniture, and hardware at discounted prices and the proceeds help fund our construction and repair efforts. Our ReStore was the sponsor for one of our recently completed homes on Clifton Street and will sponsor a house in each of our neighborhoods that will be built in the next few years.

As we look at 2026 and beyond, I am extremely excited about our strategic plan and the enormous potential for us to make an ever-growing positive impact on our communities. We look forward to the following:

- Expanding our home building efforts with forty-eight lots now in our land bank
- Reaching Veterans and deserving seniors needing critical systems and home preservation repair support to remain living comfortably and safely in their homes
- Increasing community engagement and advocacy for those in need of affordable housing solutions across Bernalillo and Sandoval counties
- Fostering stronger partnerships at the local and state level in support of affordable housing
- Continuing to build our Greater Albuquerque Habitat for Humanity team to grow and sustain excellence through the rest of this decade and beyond.

We are most grateful for the support of our donors, volunteers, and partners who aid us every day to achieve our mission. Your support means the world to us, and to those that we support and serve. By contributing to us, and supporting our programs and efforts, you are truly investing in the future of our neighbors and neighborhoods. Thank you!!

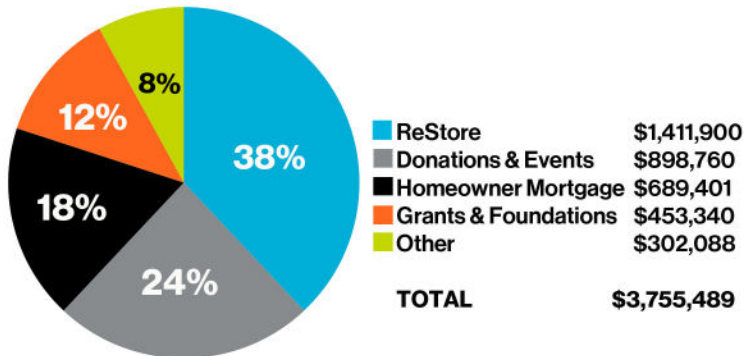

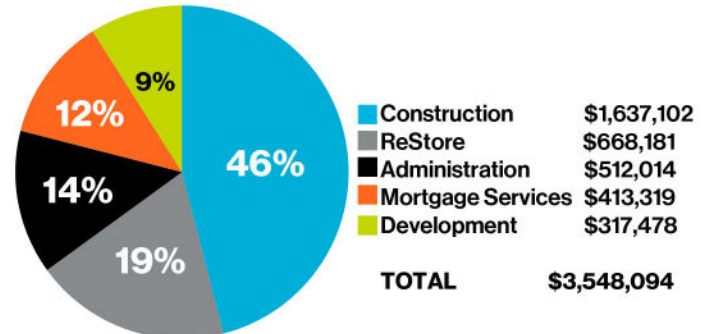

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Home Preservation – A thing of beauty

Our mission is to break the cycle of poverty through homeownership which includes enabling people to stay in their homes and age-in-place. One of the most challenging aspects of aging is not being physically or financially able to care for the home you love so much.

That is where the GAHH Home Preservation and Repair program comes in. Initiated three years ago in both Bernalillo and Sandoval counties, this program has completed over 200 projects (32 in just the last year), for low-income families, seniors, veterans and the disabled.

Services Provided Include:

- Minor non-structural exterior repairs
- Exterior Painting and Trim
- Window Caulking and Repair
- Minor Fence repair
- Ramp replacement and installation
- Porch and Stair replacements - Handrails
- Storm Doors/Screens
- Yard Cleanup (up to 15 feet from home) and basic landscaping
- Trim trees (up to 7 ft. off the ground)



Critical Systems Replacement

Our Critical Systems Replacement (CSR), program started in 2023 thanks to a grant from the City of Rio Rancho. During that 18-month time period, we were able to provide major systems replacements to 16 low-income, elderly and veteran homeowners.

What are major systems? Think of roofs, windows, heating and cooling systems, ADA accessibility upgrades inside and outside of homes. The program's goal is to provide critical repairs performed by qualified, licensed contractors to ensure

issues were resolved and meet code requirements resulting in homes that are safe and secure. In many situations, having the required repairs completed and paid for allows aging or ill homeowners on fixed or very limited incomes to remain safely in their homes reducing or eliminating the fear of housing insecurity.

Having witnessed the abject need for this program all throughout Bernalillo and Sandoval Counties, we knew we had to continue providing this program and set to work applying for funding through multiple channels.

Thanks to the NM Housing Authority (formerly MFA), the very department who provides our wonderful new construction State Tax Credit program, we have been approved two new grants for this program for the next two years.

One grant is specifically designated to veterans, and the other grant is specifically designated to seniors – two of our most vulnerable populations.

With a combined \$750,000 in funding, we anticipate being able to provide extensive home repair relief for 40 veteran homeowners and approximately 16 seniors.

This program has truly taken on a life of its own due to the considerable need in our communities.

Dear Friends and Supporters:

GAHH builds and preserves homes for our community. We support and advocate for families to realize the benefits of homeownership.

This is our mission – one we take very seriously and strive to accomplish daily. In the spirit of our mission, this fiscal year we completed and sold two new homes to first-time buyers, Ericka and Cecilia.

Both new homeowners are single mothers raising children. Both are thrilled to provide their little families with the safety and security of owning their own home. Both were moved to tears when receiving their house keys and thanking the Habitat community that contributed to building their homes. As always, these dedication ceremonies were very moving and emotional.

In November, we will break ground on two homes being built adjacent to our San Jose neighborhood, on Williams Street. The new homeowners have been chosen and will begin their sweat equity hours when we break ground. We anticipate the completion of late spring 2026 on these homes.

Immediately following, we will start infrastructure in the next six homes at 64th and Cleghorn, then 10 homes on 62nd Street. These two neighborhoods will carry our construction through 2028.

Following 62nd and 64th, we move over to build out our 82nd street neighborhood of 30 homes. That will be a phased build/occupy approach street by street.

Strategically, GAHH has the land to build through 2030, providing close to 50 new homes in our community. This is how we fulfill the mission we hold so dearly.



We have a new Donation Center in Rio Rancho!



Our ReStore is truly something to be proud of! In addition to a record year in sales at our Retail and Donation Center located at 4900 Menaul Blvd. NE Albuquerque, NM 87110, we also launched a new Donation Center conveniently located at 1525 Stephanie Rd. SE, Unit 207, Rio Rancho, NM 87124, to better serve the communities of North West Albuquerque, Sandia, Bernalillo, Rio Rancho, Corrales, Placitas, Algodones, and Santa Ana.

Our ReStore aids our mission and programs in very important ways. Once an item is dropped off to either of our two locations, it is sold in our Menaul ReStore. This revenue is then re-invested into our New Construction, Critical Systems Replacement and Home Preservation Repair Programs.

State Tax Credits for Individuals and Businesses

DID YOU KNOW?

You can financially support affordable homeownership in Bernalillo and south Sandoval Counties and receive a personal or business tax credit on your NM State Taxes.

State tax credits are available to individuals and businesses who provide donations to help build affordable housing in New Mexico. The credit is equal to up to 50 percent of the value of the donation.

Contractors, building supply companies and landowners take note! Donations may include land, buildings, money, or services. Minimum donation amount is \$1,000 up to \$1,000,000.

Tax credits may be applied to state income tax, gross receipts tax and compensating tax burdens.

Tax credits may not be applied to local option gross receipts taxes imposed by a municipality or county or to the government gross receipts tax.

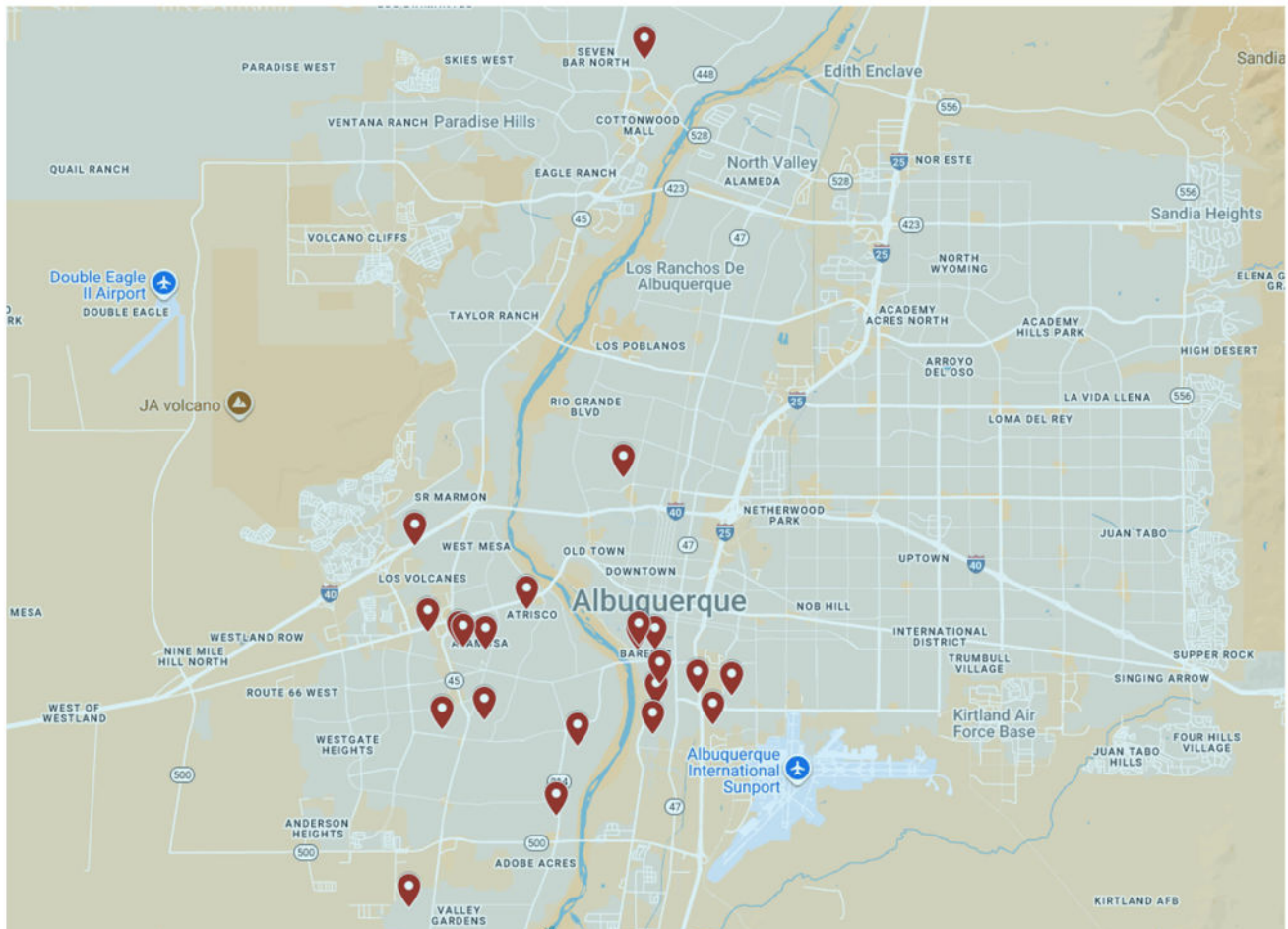
